
Mini Quilts Celebrate "The Heart of a Hero" Our Own Hero, Karen McCracken

Applesauce Pumpkin Muffins



- Prep Time- 15 minutes, Cook Time- 8 minutes
- Servings: 24 muffins (regular size)
- Calories: 25 cal.

Ingredients:

- 1 cup whole wheat flour
- 1 cup almond flour
- 2 Tablespoons plain flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- ½ teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1½ teaspoon pumpkin pie spice OR 4 teaspoons ground cinnamon, 2 teaspoons ground ginger, 1 teaspoon of ground cloves, 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- % cup maple syrup
- 4 Tablespoons unsweetened applesauce
- 1 mashed banana
- 1 egg white
- 1½ cup canned pumpkin puree
- 1 cup unsweetened, vanilla almond milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 375 F.
- 2. Spray muffin tins with cooking spray, or line with paper cups (spray paper cups to be safe), and set aside.
- 3. In a large bowl, sift together dry ingredients (whole wheat flour, almond flour, baking powder & soda, salt, and pumpkin pie spice).
- 4. In a separate bowl, whisk together wet ingredients (maple syrup, applesauce, banana, pumpkin puree, almond milk, and vanilla extract.
- 5. Add wet ingredients to dry ingredients and gently fold together with a wooden spoon, just until moistened. Be careful not to over mix the batter or the muffins will be tough.
- 6. Divide batter evenly among the prepared muffin cups. Bake for 8 minutes at 375 degrees.

A Bit of History of Snow Hill Church By Mark Wright, Historian



The deed for the land where the first Snow Hill Church was erected was acknowledged before justice of the peach Ben L. Morgan on August 14, 1877. The deed which was given to the first church trustees stated "in love and good will toward Methodist Church South the land was given and a building to be erected for church and could be used for a public school also."

The first Snow Hill School shared the same building as the first Snow Hill Church while serving the community between 1877 to 1908. Some of the first teachers at the school included Miss Genia Briggs, Mrs. Rose Henry Candler, Mr. William Wright, Mr. Robert "Bob" Franklin Gudger, Dr. George Morgan, and Miss Pearl Penland Starnes.

In 1908 a new church building was erected at the site of the first church. A new public school that was also called Snow Hill School was erected off of Hookers Gap Road. The site of this new school was on property that belonged to the family of future church member Clyde Cole.

Sunday School and church services were held at the second Snow Hill School when it became necessary, because of the construction of the new church building.
Reverend J.W. Campbell was pastor at that time.

Some of the teachers who taught at the second Snow Hill School included Mrs. Virginia Briggs, Miss Fonella Davis, Mrs. Lula Miller, Mrs. Rosa Morris Rhea, Mr. Fulton McKinney, and Mrs. Geneva Morgan Brooks.

The school term ran between four and five months in the fall and ended before Christmas. Children from the Brooks Cove area attended the first Snow Hill School. At some point in time, Mr. William Wright sent the older students to the public school in Weaverville. Soon after, a professor Clyde taught a subscription school at Snow Hill. The following year, the chairman of the school committee, Luster Herron, employed A.A. Hamlet, who combined two years many for a longer term. The following year, there was no public school, but Mr. Gus Snelson taught a subscriptions school at Snow Hill.

The teachers at the Snow Hill School in 1928-1929 were Miss Debbie Williams who taught grades one through three and Miss Helen Morris, who taught grades four through seven.

"From the Pastor's Heart"



Throughout these last few months bitter hatred, anger, and rivalry have permeated our media and lives; I have often thought of Jesus' last words in John before he went to the cross:

"The goal is for all of them to become one heart and mind- Just as you Father, are in me and I in you, So they might be one heart and mind with us."

~John 17:21 The Message.

Don't you feel that Jesus must be heartbroken about what is going on in our world today? I have heard the prophecies of the end times read from the Bible all my life, and I never could figure out what would turn father and son against each other, mother and daughter, brother and sisters. In this day of rage and outrage, deafness, blindness, and hard hearted-ness (defined as "set in our opinions and unwilling to hear or see so that we can turn and be changed), I think I finally see and understand how this prophecy could come true.

Is this election really about the issues these days? Do we believe that candidates even stand for their own party's platform? How many of us really believe anything the "other side" says is real?

other side because you have decided that they are "lying?" Do you see how Satan can use this distrust and deception against the Church, and families, and friends to divide and conquer us? And what are you willing to let God do in your life about it?

It is important that each of us vote. Our vote is a sacred right that many people have fought to win for us, through many trials, tribulations, and even sacrifice of their lives. We must take this voting responsibility seriously, and as Christians, we must vote after much prayer and soul seeking as we let Jesus lead us. Voting is our right, and in a democracy, it is also our duty.

Every person must vote their heart, and we must do it as we align our hearts with God. Will we all agree? No. We will not. But we can still be One in the Spirit of God, the Lordship of Jesus, and the love of God.

Do not be swayed by passing whims, Facebook posts, biased news broadcasts, or other hypocrisy. The other side <u>IS</u> wrong. But so is your side. The "wrong" of every political platform and candidate comes from human sin and hypocrisy, and we have to recognize that we give excuses for our candidates behavior and shortcomings, while wanting to hold the other sides' candidates accountable for their actions.

In these last days before the election, I encourage you to withdraw your heart from Satan's lies of despair, and fix your eyes on Jesus. Open your heart to Jesus and let Jesus lead you. Let Jesus inform you. Let your heart be sure in our Lord and King, Our Righteousness: Jesus.
